Welcome to West Kirby School Residential Provision

Our 38 week residential provision provides a safe and nurturing environment to support our young people, in both their personal development and their learning.

Our off-site setting allows for a more independent approach, naturalising – as far as possible – the experience of residential placement to that of a natural home.

At West Kirby School and College, we believe that in order to enable a young person to reach their full potential, we provide a holistic approach to meet individual needs.

Activities, community participation & life skills

The residential setting compliments education as part of a seamless 24-hour curriculum, with our residential staff forming part of the whole school team.

Our residents can expect to develop personal life skills which will support them through education and ease their transition into adulthood. These include many areas such as personal welfare, hygiene, Protected Characteristics, understanding physical, gender and cultural needs, food planning and preparation, diet and nutrition and social communication development; giving our young people the confidence to grow and develop independently.

The residential groups offer a range of activities over the week, aimed at developing social skills, encouraging personal choices, friendships, supporting independence and reinforcing their 'formal' education through practical application. Our young people are given choice and we encourage independence.

- Help them get a good education
- Help them be healthy and enjoy life
- Support their independence, future and next adventure



Introduction to our residential settings

Within a short distance of our school, our provision consists of the main house, supporting up to six residents and also our new development, The Grove, for up to two young people who are developing independence.

The small homely environments allow our young people to feel safe, while developing life, social, communication and independence skills.

All residents have access to an en-suite bedroom which they can personalise to their own taste. The house has an established large private garden, for relaxation and our residents can enjoy growing their own vegetables during the summer time.

Located within only a few miles of school, young people have the opportunity to take the bus or walk home at the end of the school day; developing their independent travel skills. Evening activities often involve visits to local beaches and the coast.





Our semi-independent provision - The Grove



A new development for 2021, The Grove is a semiindependent setting attached to the main residential home.

There are two en-suite bedrooms and a shared kitchen living space, opening to a patio area and the garden.

Pupils have more responsibility for continuing development towards independence and enhancing their personal and social skills.



Parents say that they are fully included in the plans and that residential staff make a difference in helping children plan for their futures.
