
























Year 11 activity weeks

It was a real positive supportive atmosphere and we were proud of how many pupils were involved in the performances and engaged for the event.






























Enterprise Market

Humanities update

Lake District Residential for GCSE Geography group

GCSE Geography is one of the options at KS4 for our pupils. This term our Year 10 Geography group set off for a Residential field trip to the Lake District.

One of our pupils shared their experiences with us: "On Wednesday 28th June the GCSE Geography group; Alex, Marco and Mia along with Mr Cox, Miss Allison and Mr Hulme set off for the Lake District.

The group were completing a fieldwork assignment as part of their GCSE. This consisted of following a river a source to mouth whilst analysing how it changes. To find the source (or one of them) pupils had to climb Fox Fold off the Honister Pass and follow the small stream uphill. Pupils measured width and depth as well as recording sample sizes of river sediment along the rivers course.

The team then travelled North towards Cockermouth to view and measure the middle course of the river. Cockermouth is prone to flooding and has had some devastating disasters due to its position at the confluence of the River Cocker and the River Derwent.





Pupils visited some of the hard and soft engineering projects around the town, built in place to protect the town and its residents from future floods."

Pupils and staff had a great time on what was for many, their first residential trip with West Kirby and are excited to plan their next educational field-trip (adventure!).

Primary go sailing

In June our Primary Adventurers & Navgiators classes went for an introduction to sailing, with Merseyside Waterports at West Kirby Marine Lake.

It was a fantastic experience, a first for many, learning key sailing skills and working together in teams to sail the boat. The pupils took on the new challenge well and a big thank you to the staff.
