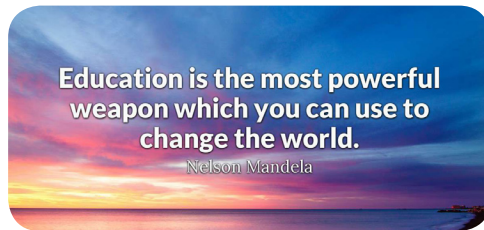


Our School Development Plan

11. Improve how we support you in developing life skills and Relationship & Sex Education

14. Plan and deliver support for pupils in a more organized way

15. To give you more chances to improve your Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development, so that you feel more confident as you get older
