

#### This busy term saw the school achieve the Leading Parent Partnership Award and culminated in a hugely successful OFSTED, in which the school was graded 'Outstanding'.

This is no mean feat as, following the change in the OFSTED framework in 2018, the number of special schools maintaining Outstanding has been consistently reducing. A huge thank you to all the colleges that provided WKS pupils with the experiences that will help them ihn preparation for making a decision and transition when the time comes.

WKS were able to invite some of the colleges into school for a Meet the College event, which was a great success across the school. The opportunity to chat with local colleges within a safe, familiar environment is a good stepping stone to transition to college visits.

Pupils from Year 7 through to Post 16 joined us in the afternoon for their opportunity to chat with colleges independently, before parents and carers joined us for the event. Pupils and parents were able to tour WKS Post 16 and meet with teachers and staff in our revamped classes.

Our Animal Care team is run by Mrs Booth, Miss Allison and Animal Care Technician Miss Hitchmough. Years 7-9 have Animal Care on their timetable each week and BTEC Animal Care is a new option for pupils at KS4.

Pupils have been involved in choosing and buying the animals and researching to get their habitat ready for arrival. All names have also been chosen by our pupils which creates some excitement around the school!

Our school mini zoo is growing quickly and includes:

- Reptiles Jessie the tortoise and we're hoping for snakes, bearded dragons and geckos
- Mammals Rabbits Latte & Cookie Dough, guinea pigs - Stacey & Maggie and our new mice
- Birds Our chickens which live in the chicken coop built by pupils.
- Insects A stick insect collection
- The opportunity to meet visiting dogs and cats.









#### Benefits of animal care

Having animals to care for ties in with the school curriculum of developing emotional and social needs – empathy, care, love, compassion, understanding, commitment and building confidence.

Pets can also encourage a child's learning needs, especially in reading, communication, observation and speaking. It also brings wider benefits including lowering anxiety, teaching skills about treating others kindly and cautiously, modelling gentle behaviour and teaching compassion. It's a great conversation starter that allows friendships to grow and social skills to be learnt.

BTEC Animal Care broadens our vocational subjects and options at KS4, with the opportunity to gain employability and learn life skills.





#### Summer School 2021 was the opportunity for our new Year 7 pupils to build friendships with their classmates and forge relationships with some of their new teachers.

After a difficult few years, it was an opportunity designed to support pupil wellbeing and ensure a smoother transition into Year 7 for both our pupils already at WKS and those who were just joining us.

Summer school was split into two weeks, with each week dedicated to a separate Year 7 class, Class EC and Class RD. The focus of summer school was not academic, but focused more on the social interactions and enjoying activities that had not been accessible over the last fifteen months. However, elements of Maths, English and Science were covered each day in activities such as shopping (money) and cooking (weights and measures/reactions of ingredients when put together.)

During the second week, pupils were able to experience the joys and frustrations of mini golf (building resilience and tolerance), have a barbeque (managing risk and personal safety), visit the animals at Tam O'Shanter Farm and get wet and muddy at Manley Mere (team building).





They took part in craft activities with all pupils producing items to take home including tie-dyed t-shirts, hama bead designs and mugs.

The two weeks were a great success and were enjoyed by both pupils and staff alike. Some pupils have requested that they attend again next year, as they enjoyed it so much.

### Music department update
